**“The Road to the Court of Appeals: Demystifying the Process”**

**The Commission on Judicial Nomination to Hold Open Discussions  
About Nomination Process in Connection with the Coming Vacancy in the Seat Now  
Held by Chief Judge Jonathan Lippman**

In an effort to demystify the selection process for Judges of New York’s highest court, the Court of Appeals, the Commission on Judicial Nomination will host an informational meeting on Friday, June 19, 2015, from 12:30 PM – 1:30 PM, at the New York State Bar Association, 1 Elk Street, Albany, New York 12207.

Under the Constitution of the State of New York, the Commission on Judicial Nomination is entrusted with responsibility for evaluating, and then recommending to the Governor, candidates to fill vacancies on the Court of Appeals. The Commission vigorously seeks out, carefully evaluates, and then recommends to the Governor well-qualified candidates from the extraordinary, diverse community of lawyers admitted to practice in New York State for at least ten years.

On January 1, 2016, a vacancy on the Court will exist due to Chief Judge Jonathan Lippman's mandatory retirement by reason of age. Under the Constitution of the State of New York, Judges of the Court must retire at the end of the year in which they turn seventy. As part of the Commission's process of identifying and recommending candidates to fill vacancies on the Court, the Commission conducts meetings to discuss the requirements for the position and the Commission's procedures and rules for submitting recommendations of qualified candidates. The meetings are open to the public, and all are encouraged to attend and express their views (orally or in writing) about community needs, the general qualifications for judicial office, and the nominating process.

Judith S. Kaye, former Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals and the sitting Chair of the Commission, will host the informational meeting on June 19 at the New York State Bar Association in Albany. She will discuss the process of applying to join the Court of Appeals with former Associate Judge Howard A. Levine. In addition to Judges Kaye and Levine, scheduled speakers and panelists include:
